Pursuant to the provisions of section 3507 of the Elections Code, you are hereby informed that on this day we mailed to Goldie Joseph, R. Weldon Crabb, Fred Louis B. Strong, Gilbert W. Ferguson, Virginia Aline Cargill, Terry A. Trupp, Hazel A. Mitchell and Robert L. Miller, as proponents, the following title and summary:

LOCAL CONTROL OF COASTAL ZONE. INITIATIVE STATUTE.
Repeals California Coastal Zone Conservation Act of 1972. Defines "coastal zone" and "development." Gives city or county exclusive authority to regulate development within coastal zone, or any part thereof, within its jurisdiction. Would make null and void any statute in conflict with this measure which is to become effective after date of passage of this measure. If proposed initiative is adopted, there would be minor cost savings to the state.

INITIATIVE MEASURE TO BE SUBMITTED DIRECTLY TO THE ELECTORS

The Attorney General of California has prepared the following title and summary of the chief purpose and points of the proposed measure:

TO THE HONORABLE SECRETARY OF STATE OF CALIFORNIA

We, the undersigned, registered, qualified electors of California, residents of _____ County (or City and County), hereby propose amendments to the Government Code and the Public Resources Code, relating to the California Coastal Zone Conservation Commission, and petition the Secretary of State to submit the same to the electors of California for their adoption or rejection at the next succeeding general election or at any special state-wide election held prior to that general election or as otherwise provided by law. The proposed statutory amendments (An act to add Title 7.55 (commencing with Section 67200) to, and to repeal Section 66455.6 of, the Government Code, and to repeal Division 18 (commencing with Section 27000) of the Public Resources Code; relating to the California Coastal Zone Conservation Commission) read as follows:

Section 1. Division 18 (commencing with Section 27000) of the Public Resources Code is repealed.

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Sec. 2. Section 66455.6 of the Government Code is repealed.

~~66455.6. The clerk of the legislative body or the advisory agency of each local agency having jurisdiction over any part of the coastal zone, as defined in Section 27100 of the Public Resources Code, shall transmit to the office of the California Coastal Zone Conservation Commission within three days after the receipt thereof, one copy of each tentative map of any subdivision located, wholly or partly, within the coastal zone, and such commission may, within 15 days thereafter, make recommendations to the appropriate local agency regarding the effect of the proposed subdivision upon the California Coastal Zone Conservation Plan. This section does not exempt any such subdivision from the permit requirements of Chapter 5 (commencing with Section 27400) of Division 18 of the Public Resources Code.~~

~~This section shall remain in effect only until the first day of January after the final adjournment of the 1975-76 Regular Session of the Legislature and as of that date is repealed.~~

Sec. 3. Title 7.55 (commencing with Section 67200) is added to the Government Code, to read:

TITLE 7.55. CALIFORNIA COASTAL ZONE

67200. As used in this title, the terms "coastal zone" and "development" have the same meaning as in the repealed California Coastal Zone Conservation Act of 1972, and are defined as follows:

- (a) "Coastal zone" means that land and water area of the State of California from the border of the State of Oregon to the border of the Republic of Mexico, extending seaward to the outer limit of the state jurisdiction, including all islands within the jurisdiction of the state, and extending inland to the highest elevation of the nearest coastal mountain range, except that in Los Angeles, Orange, and San Diego Counties, the inland boundary of the coastal zone shall be the highest elevation of the nearest coastal mountain range or five miles from the mean high tide line, whichever is the shorter distance.

subdivision, (b) "Development" means, on land, in or under water, the placement or erection of any solid material or structure; discharge or disposal of any dredged material or of any gaseous, liquid, solid, or thermal waste; grading, removing, dredging, mending, or extraction of any materials; change in the density or intensity of use of land, including, but not limited to, subdivision of land pursuant to the Subdivision Map Act and any other division of land, including lot splits; change in the intensity of use of water, ecology related thereto, or of access thereto; construction, reconstruction, demolition, or alteration of the size of any structure, including any facility of any private, public or municipal utility, and the removal or logging of major vegetation. As used in this ~~section~~ "structure" includes, but is not limited to, any building, road, pipe, flume, conduit, siphon, aqueduct, telephone line, and electrical power transmission and distribution line.

67201. A city or county shall have the exclusive authority to regulate development within the coastal zone, or any part of the coastal zone, which is within its jurisdiction.

Any law enacted by the Legislature which is to become effective on or after the effective date of this title that is in conflict with this title is null and void.
