INITIATIVE MEASURE TO BE SUBMITTED DIRECTLY TO THE VOTERS

The Attorney General of California has prepared the following title and summary of the chief purpose and points of the proposed measure:

TO THE HONORABLE SECRETARY OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

We, the undersigned, registered, qualified voters of California, residents of \_\_\_\_\_ County (or City and County), hereby propose amendments to the Health and Safety Code, relating to motor vehicle fuel vapor recovery systems, and petition the Secretary of State to submit the same to the voters of California for their adoption or rejection at the next succeeding general election or at any special statewide election held prior to that general election or otherwise provided by law. The proposed statutory amendments add Section 41963 to the Health and Safety Code to read as follows:

PROPOSED LAW

Section 1. Section 41963 is added to the Health and Safety Code, to read:

41963. Neither the state nor any local governmental entity shall enact any law, or adopt any rule or regulation, requiring the installation or use of a motor vehicle fuel vapor recovery system in the retail sale of motor vehicle fuel at a service station until the federal government has approved such a motor vehicle fuel vapor recovery system for installation and use in all states.

MOTOR VEHICLE FUEL VAPOR RECOVERY SYSTEM. INITIATIVE STATUTE.

Adds statute providing that neither the state nor any local government shall require the installation or use of a motor vehicle fuel vapor recovery system in the retail sale of motor vehicle fuel at a service station until the federal government has approved such a system for installation and use in all states. Fiscal impact on state and local governments: There would be no direct state or local fiscal impact.
