(If the Proponent files the petition with the county on a date prior to 1/11/82, the county has five working days from the filing of the petition to determine the total number of signatures affixed to the petition and to transmit this total to the Secretary of State.) Elections Code Section 3520(b).

* Date adjusted for official deadline which falls on Saturday.

+ PLEASE NOTE: To Proponent(s) who wish to qualify for the 1982 Primary Election. The law allows up to 55 days to county election officials for checking and reporting petition signatures. The law also requires that this process be completed 131 days before the election in which the people will vote on any initiative. It is possible that the county may not need the whole 55 days. But if you want to be sure that this initiative qualifies for the 1982 Primary Election, you should file this petition with the county by December 3, 1981.

- d. Last day for county to determine number of qualified electors who have signed the petition, and to transmit certificate with a blank copy of the petition to the Secretary of State Tuesday, 2/02/82

(If the Secretary of State notifies the counties to determine the number of qualified electors who signed the petition on a date prior to 1/18/82 the last day is not later than the fifteenth day after the notification.)
Elections Code Section 3520(d), (e).

- e. If the signature count is between 498,411 and 609,169 then the Secretary of State notifies the counties using the random sampling technique to determine the validity of all signatures.

Last day for county to determine actual number of all qualified electors who signed the petition, and to transmit certificate with a blank copy of the petition to the Secretary of State..... Thursday, 3/04/82

(If the Secretary of State notifies the counties to determine the number of qualified electors who have signed the petition on a date prior to 2/02/82, the last day is not later than the thirtieth day after the notification.)
Elections Code Section 3521(b), (c).

4. Campaign Statements

- Last day for Proponent(s) to file a Campaign Statement of Receipts and Expenditures for period ending 2/09/82 Tuesday, 2/16/82 *

(If the Secretary of State finds that the measure has either qualified or failed to qualify on a date earlier than 1/11/82, the last date to file is the 35th calendar day after the deadline for filing petitions or the date of notification by the Secretary of State that the measure has either qualified or failed to qualify, whichever is earlier. The closing date for the campaign statement is seven days prior to the filing deadline.)



The Attorney General of California has prepared the following title and summary of the chief purpose and points of the proposed measure:

EDUCATION FUNDING. INITIATIVE CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT. Amends Constitution to add the provision that from all state revenues there shall first be provided a minimum level of support for public education in grades kindergarten through twelve in an amount equal to that available from state and local tax sources to these public school systems for the 1981-82 school year adjusted for enrollment and the consumer price index. Fiscal impact on state or local governments: If this amendment is adopted and implemented, state costs would increase approximately \$400 million in 1982-1983 and \$850 million in 1983-1984.


As per your phone conversation with Mr. Ski Harrison on June 24, 1981, I am sending you this revised request for an initiative to amend the California Consitution.

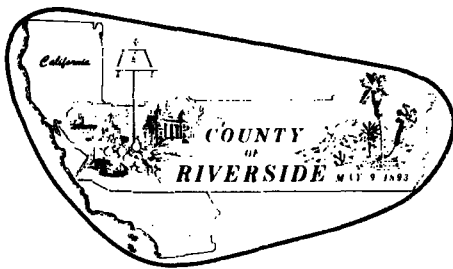

EDUCATION FUNDING INITIATIVE LAUNCHED REPORTS EU

SACRAMENTO -- The beginning of a citizens' effort to maintain the current levels of education funding was announced today (August 13) by Secretary of State March Fong Eu. It is the thirteenth initiative drive of 1981; the first relating to education.

Sponsored by Michael Davis of El Toro, the "Education Funding" initiative is a constitutional amendment requiring 553,790 registered voter signatures by January 11, 1982 to be placed on the ballot. If proponent Davis wishes to qualify the measure for the June 1982 primary election ballot, he must submit all signatures by December 3, 1981.

The initiative proposes an amendment to the State Constitution to provide that "From all state revenues there shall first be provided a minimum level of support for public education in grades kindergarten through twelve in an amount equal to that available from state and local tax sources to these public school systems for the 1981-82 school year, adjusted for enrollment and the Consumer Price Index."

A copy of this initiative, its title, summary and circulation calendar is attached.
