

SPACE STATION. INITIATIVE STATUTE. Sets forth findings and declarations regarding the space program. Provides that the Governor shall sign and deliver to the President a statement that the People of the State of California respectfully request the President and Congress of these United States to direct the National Aeronautics and Space Administration to establish, before 1990, a permanently inhabited Space Station. Summary of estimate by Legislative Analyst and Director of Finance of fiscal impact on state and local governments: The adoption of this measure would have no direct fiscal impact on California state and local governments.



## THE SPACE INITIATIVE

### Findings and Declaration

**Section 1:** We the People of the State of California do find and declare that,

- (a) The National Goal of Landing a Man on the Moon demonstrated that American talent, commitment, and resources could accomplish a task once believed impossible, and
- (b) An unprecedented quarter-century of Space Exploration has greatly expanded our understanding of the Earth, our companion planets, and the universe beyond, and
- (c) NASA's programs have resulted in extraordinary scientific and technological advances that have returned, over twelve years, approximately \$14 billion for each \$1 billion invested, and
- (d) A reusable Space Shuttle is now available to transport materials and products back to Earth from research and industrial facilities that can utilize the unique resources and environment of space, and
- (e) Establishing such orbiting facilities with international participation will reaffirm our society's creative leadership in a rapidly changing world by combining a pioneering spirit with a positive vision for our future.

### Text of Transmittal

**Section 2:** Within one month after enactment of this statute, the Governor of the State of California shall sign and cause to be delivered to the President of the United States, the following, that:

The People of the State of California respectfully request the President and Congress of these United States to direct the National Aeronautics and Space Administration to establish, before this decade is out, a permanently inhabited Space Station, as the cornerstone of an expanded and continuing civilian space program for the benefit of all humanity.





SPACE STATION INITIATIVE LAUNCHED, REPORTS EU

SACRAMENTO -- The President and Congress would direct the National Aeronautics and Space Administration to establish, by 1990, a "permanently inhabited Space Station, as the cornerstone of an expanded and continuing civilian space program for the benefit of all humanity" under the terms of a new initiative, Secretary of State March Fong Eu announced today (May 19).

The "Space Station Initiative," a statutory drive launched by five Oakland residents, requires 393,835 registered voter signatures by Oct. 17 to win a ballot position next June.

Richard Hoagland, Donald Robertson, Timothy Kyger, Jay Miller, and Marc Jones, telephone (415) 654-2308, propose the measure that, if passed by voters, would required California's governor to send a notice to the President directing the establishment of the permanently-inhabited space station.

In their statement of findings and declarations, proponents state that the talent, commitment and resources are available for establishing the space station, based on the U.S. having landed a man on the moon; the U.S. space exploration program "has greatly expanded our understanding of the Earth, our companion planets, and the universe beyond;" NASA's programs have returned fourteen-fold the invested money due to "extraordinary scientific and technological advances;" "a reusable space shuttle is now available to transport materials and products back to Earth from research and industrial facilities that can utilize the unique resources and environment of space;" and that, by establishing these "orbiting facilities with international participation" we "will reaffirm our society's creative leadership in a rapidly changing world by combining a pioneering spirit with a positive vision of the future."

ONE INITIATIVE QUALIFIES, THREE FAIL

SACRAMENTO -- The initiative sponsored by Paul Gann has qualified for the June 5, 1984 primary election ballot, Secretary of State March Fong Eu announced today (Nov. 7).

Titled "Legislature: Rules, Procedures, Powers, Funding," the initiative statute needed 393,835 registered voter signatures. Raw signatures totaling 559,760 were collected, and random sample signature verifications conducted by county election officials indicated 458,144 were valid. While signature certifications are still outstanding for Lake and Mono counties, the measure is over the 433,218 projected valid signatures required for qualification. When an initiative qualifies based on random sample projections, it must contain at least 110% of the required number of signatures, hence the 433,218 figure.

The largest number of signatures came from Los Angeles, Orange, San Diego, San Bernardino, and Sacramento counties. Overall the projected validity rate was 81.8% statewide.

Three recent initiatives did not fare so well as did Gann's. Dr. Eu announced that the proponents of "Marijuana-Hemp," "Space Station," and "Utility Rates" failed to collect sufficient signatures to place the initiatives on the June 1984 ballot.

There remain ten initiatives in circulation for either the June or November 1984 ballots.

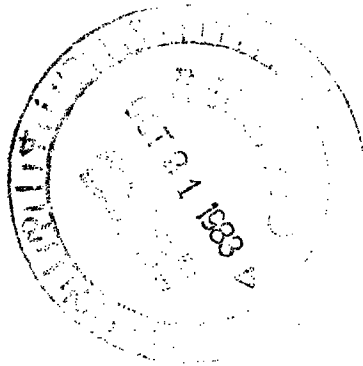

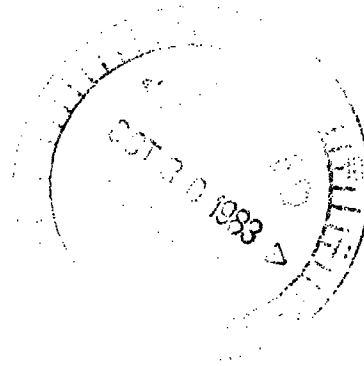

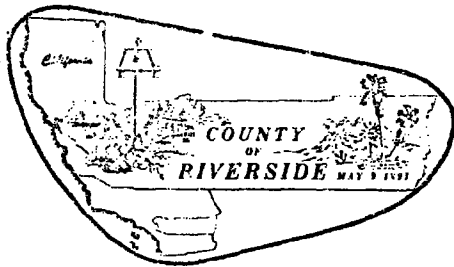
