

The Attorney General of California has prepared the following title and summary of the chief purpose and points of the proposed measure:

BALLISTIC MISSILE DEFENSE POLICY DECLARATION: INITIATIVE STATUTE.

States that the people of California find that no protection whatever is provided from a devastating nuclear ballistic missile attack; that this situation can be remedied by deployment of non-nuclear strategic defenses based upon now available technology for less than five percent of federal defense budget. Measure sets forth specific text of communication which the Governor is commanded to send to the President and other federal officials expressing concern over safety from nuclear attack and urging the federal government to take necessary measures to develop and deploy non-nuclear defenses against ballistic missiles. Summary of estimate by Legislative Analyst and Director of Finance of fiscal impact on state and local governments: The measure would have no direct fiscal impact on state and local governments.

Text of Proposed Law

This initiative measure is submitted to the people in accordance with the provisions of Article II, Section 8 of the Constitution.

This measure proposes to add new provisions to the law. Therefore, the new provisions to be added are printed in italic type to indicate that they are new.

PROPOSED LAW

AN INITIATIVE IN FAVOR OF DEVELOPMENT AND DEPLOYMENT OF A STRATEGIC DEFENSE OF THE UNITED STATES

Section 1. Finding and Declarations. We the people of the State of California, do hereby find and declare:

(a) The safety and security of the United States are the primary obligation of the Federal Government, and must be paramount in the concerns of the American people.

(b) As of today, no protection whatever is provided for the people of California or the rest of the nation from devastating attack by any nation or person possessing nuclear ballistic missiles, a situation that can be remedied by the deployment of non-nuclear strategic defenses based upon now available U.S. technology at a cost less than 5% of the current defense budget.

(c) This measure is necessary to reduce the threat of nuclear attack, whether deliberate or accidental, to the health and well-being of the citizens of California and the entire country.

Section 2. Text of Transmittal. The Governor shall prepare and transmit on or before January 31, 1989 the following written communication to the President of the United States, the Secretary of Defense, the Secretary of State, and all Members of the United States Congress:

"The people of the State of California, recognizing that the safety and security of the United States must be paramount in the concerns of the American people; and further recognizing that our national security is reduced, not increased by our total defenselessness from a deliberate nuclear ballistic missile attack, or from an accidental missile launch or third country attack with nuclear ballistic missiles which could result in millions of deaths of people of California and throughout the nation; do hereby urge that the Government of the United States now take the necessary measures to develop and deploy non-nuclear defenses against ballistic missiles using available technology."

A CALIFORNIA BALLOT INITIATIVE IN SUPPORT OF THE STRATEGIC DEFENSE OF THE UNITED STATES

(Suggested summary text and format. Official title, text, summary and analysis to be prepared by the Attorney General.)

SUMMARY OF INITIATIVE STATUTE ON STRATEGIC DEFENSE. This measure identifies the people's concern about the vulnerability of the United States to ballistic missile attack; specifically; that the United States has no means to intercept and destroy a ballistic missile in flight before its nuclear warhead can impact upon the U.S. homeland. This statute requires the Governor of California to write a specified communication to the President of the United States and other specified United States officials urging them to take the necessary steps to ensure the defense of the U.S. homeland against nuclear ballistic missiles through the development and deployment of available technologies so that the people of California and the United States may begin to enjoy a degree of protection as soon as possible.

Analysis

Background:

The Constitution of the United States sets forth the primary obligation of the Federal Government, "... to provide for the common defense." The Constitution charges the President with the responsibility for the common defense as Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces, and empowers the Congress to raise and maintain the military forces necessary to meet this obligation. It further provides that the people may petition the Government to express their views.

Since 1972, the defenselessness of our nation has been mandated by the policy of Mutual Assured Destruction.

Proposal:

This measure requires the Governor of California to transmit by January 31, 1989 a letter to the President, the Secretary of Defense, the Secretary of State, and all Members of Congress. This letter must urge the Federal Government to carry out its legal and moral obligation of defense by beginning immediately the process of development and deployment of ballistic missile defenses. The exact contents of this letter are set forth in the following text of the Initiative.

Fiscal Effects:

This measure would have no direct fiscal effect on state and local governments. However, the indirect effects, through revenues to the State from increased activity in the high technology sectors of the economy may increase greatly.
