+ PLEASE NOTE: To the Proponent who may wish to qualify for the June 5, 1990 Primary Election. The law allows approximately 85 days for county election officials to check and report petition signatures and transmit results. The law also requires that this process be completed 131 days before the election in which the people will vote on the initiative. It is possible that the county may not need precisely 85 days. But if you want to be sure that this initiative qualifies for the June 5, 1990 Primary Election, you should file this petition with the county before October 17, 1989.

If the signature count is between 565,711 and 655,033 inclusive, then the Secretary of State notifies the counties using the random sampling technique to determine the validity of all signatures Sunday, 12/24/89**



The Attorney General of California has prepared the following title and summary of the chief purpose and points of the proposed measure:

SCHOOL PRAYER. INITIATIVE CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT. Permits "The Lord's Prayer" to be said aloud for graduation, plays, and assemblies at California public schools for those who wish to pray. Otherwise prohibits school officials, employees, classmates, guests, or others from advising or teaching their form of belief in prayer to any student at California public schools. Provides that each child/student willing to pray in silence must be taught to pray at home by a parent or other guardian their form of prayer. Requests two minutes of silent prayer or quiet meditation for those that do not believe in prayer. Summary of estimate by Legislative Analyst and Director of Finance of fiscal impact on state and local governments: The measure's lack of specificity makes it impossible to estimate its fiscal impact.



ELECTION DATE, PRAYER INITIATIVES BEGIN CIRCULATION REPORTS EU

SACRAMENTO — Two more initiatives have reached the signature-gathering stage as a measure to set election dates immediately after tax deadlines and one to allow silent prayer or quiet meditation in public schools were approved for circulation, Secretary of State March Fong Eu announced today (June 12).

Dr. Eu normally advises proponents of initiatives to begin their drives one year before the date of the election ballot on which they hope their measures will appear, and it seems sponsors are taking her advice seriously, as seven initiative drives, including the two today, have begun within the past ten weeks. All are aimed at the June 5, 1990 ballot.

The "Election Dates" initiative, a statutory measure requiring 372,178 registered voter signatures by Nov. 6, is sponsored by Thomas Neece of San Francisco, telephone (415) 586-1393. If approved by voters, the initiative would require "city, county and state elections to be held on a weekend (Saturday and Sunday) following the designated Friday when any city, county or state taxes are due and payable."

The "School Prayer" initiative is a constitutional amendment needing 595,485 registered voter signatures by Nov. 6 to qualify for the June 1990 ballot. Proponent Eunice Parquet of Oakland, no telephone number listed, seeks to "permit 'The Lord's Prayer' to be said aloud for graduation, plays, and assemblies at California public schools for those who wish to pray; otherwise

prohibits school officials, employees, classmates, guests, or others from advising or teaching their form of belief in prayer to any students at California public schools; provides that each child/student willing to pray in silence must be taught to pray at home by a parent or other guardian their form of prayer; requests two minutes of silent prayer or quiet meditation for those that do not believe in prayer."

To put the initiative season in perspective, historically this is not an unusual number of initiatives to be in circulation, although it's still early in the election cycle. Since the initiative process was adopted in 1911, a total of 680 initiatives have been titled and summarized for circulation, averaging nearly 16 per election year. The record number of attempts was set in 1982 when 65 initiatives received title and summary, followed by 1988's 63, 1980's 59, and 1984's 45. Record lows of two attempts occurred in 1939, 1954 and 1956. Of attempts, an average 31.17% actually reach the ballot. Once reaching the ballot, an initiative's chances for voter approval are 31.13%; however, only 9.7% of all attempts ultimately gain voter approval.

Initiatives dealing with reapportionment, AIDS research, right to keep and bear arms, split roll property taxes, and criminal law are already in circulation.
