

+ NOTE TO PROPONENTS WHO WISH TO QUALIFY FOR THE NOVEMBER 6, 1990 GENERAL ELECTION: The law allows approximately 107 days for county election officials to check and report petition signatures and transmit results. The law also requires that this process be completed 131 days before the election in which the people will vote on the initiative. It is possible that the county may not need precisely 107 days. However, if you want to be sure that this initiative qualifies for the November 6, 1990 General Election, you should file this petition with the county before March 23, 1990.

d. Secretary of State determines whether the total number of signatures filed with all county clerks meets the minimum number of required signatures, and notifies the counties
.....Wednesday, 5/30/90**

e. Last day for county to determine total number of qualified voters who signed the petition, and to transmit certificate with a blank copy of the petition to the Secretary of State
.....Wednesday, 6/20/90

(If the Secretary of State notifies the county to determine the number of qualified voters who signed the petition on a date other than 5/21/90, the last day is no later than the fifteenth day after the county's receipt of notification.) Elec. C., Sec. 3520(d), (e).

f. If the signature count is more than 409,395 or less than 353,569, then the Secretary of State certifies the petition has qualified or failed, and notifies the counties. If the signature count is between 353,569 and 409,395 inclusive, then the Secretary of State notifies the counties using the random sampling technique to determine the validity of all signatures

g. Last day for county to determine actual number of all qualified voters who signed the petition, and to transmit certificate with a blank copy of the petition to the Secretary of State.....Monday, 8/13/90

(If the Secretary of State notifies the county to determine the number of qualified voters who have signed the petition on a date other than 6/20/90, the last day is no later than the thirtieth working day after county's receipt of notification.) Elec. C., Sec. 3521(b), (c).

h. Secretary of State certifies whether the petition has been signed by the number of qualified voters required to declare the petition sufficient



5. Important Points:

- (a) California law prohibits the use of signatures, names and addresses gathered on initiative petitions for any purpose other than to qualify the initiative measure for the ballot. This means that the petitions cannot be used to create or add to mailing lists or similar lists for any purpose, including fund raising or requests for support. Any such misuse constitutes a crime under California law. Elections Code section 29770; *Bilofsky v. Deukmejian* (1981) 123 Cal.App. 3d 825, 177 Cal.Rptr. 621; 63 Ops. Cal.Atty.Gen. 37 (1980).
- (b) Please refer to Elections Code section 44, 3501, 3507, 3508, 3517, and 3519 for appropriate format and type consideration in printing, typing, and otherwise preparing your initiative petition for circulation and signatures. Please send a copy of the petition after you have it printed. This copy is not for our review or approval, but to supplement our file.
- (c) Your attention is directed to the campaign disclosure requirements of the Political Reform Act of 1974, Government Code section 81000 et seq.
- (d) When writing or calling state or county elections officials, provide the official title of the initiative which was prepared by the Attorney General. Use of this title will assist elections officials in referencing the proper file.
- (e) When a petition is presented to the county elections official for filing by someone other than the proponent, the required authorization shall include the name or names of the persons filing the petition.
- (f) When filing the petition with the county elections official, please provide a blank petition for elections official use.

We, the undersigned, registered, qualified voters of California, residents of ____ County (or City and County), hereby propose the following measure, relating to a "Day Without Starvation," and petition the Secretary of State to submit the same to the voters of California for their adoption or rejection at the next succeeding general election or at any special statewide election held prior to that general election or otherwise provided by law. The proposed measure reads as follows:

SECTION 1. The Governor shall proclaim a date

within three years of the effective date of this act as a "Day Without Starvation."

SEC. 2. The Legislature of the State of California shall adopt a resolution urging the Congress of the United States to proclaim a "Day Without Starvation" concurrent with the date designated by the Governor pursuant to this act, and to provide funding for breakfast for every human being on earth on that day, as well as funding for related administrative costs.

SEC. 3. The provisions of this act may be amended by the Legislature so long as the amendments are consistent with the purposes of this act.



STARVATION MEASURE IN CIRCULATION, REPORTS EU

SACRAMENTO — Secretary of State March Fong Eu announced today (Dec. 14) that she has given a San Bernardino woman the green light to begin circulating petitions relating to starvation.

The measure is an initiative statute that directs the governor to proclaim a date within three years of the measure's effective date to be a "Day Without Starvation." It requires further that the Legislature adopt a resolution urging Congress to issue a similar proclamation "concurrent with the date designated by the Governor. . ." and to ". . . provide funding for breakfast for every human being on earth on that day, as well as funding for related administrative costs."

Proponent Eleanor D. George, telephone (714) 882-5099, must collect 372,178 signatures of registered voters and submit them to county elections officials by May 14, the 150-day deadline. Since the law allows approximately 107 days for elections officials to verify signatures, she is encouraged to submit them by Mar. 23 in order to ensure that the process is completed before the June 26 measure qualification deadline for the Nov. 6, 1990 general election ballot.

With the addition of this measure, there are now 14 initiatives in circulation. Deadlines for two of these, both relating to reapportionment, are today (Dec. 14) and Monday (Dec. 18).

A copy of the initiative, its circulation calendar and title and summary is attached.
