5. Important Points:

- (a) California law prohibits the use of signatures, names and addresses gathered on initiative petitions for any purpose other than to qualify the initiative measure for the ballot. This means that the petitions cannot be used to create or add to mailing lists or similar lists for any purpose, including fund raising or requests for support. Any such misuse constitutes a crime under California law. Elections Code section 29770; *Bilofsky v. Deukmejian* (1981) 123 Cal.App. 3d 825, 177 Cal.Rptr. 621; 63 Ops. Cal.Atty.Gen. 37 (1980).
- (b) Please refer to Elections Code sections 41, 41.5, 44, 3501, 3507, 3508, 3517, and 3519 for appropriate format and type consideration in printing, typing, and otherwise preparing your initiative petition for circulation and signatures. Please send a copy of the petition after you have it printed. This copy is not for our review or approval, but to supplement our file.
- (c) Your attention is directed to the campaign disclosure requirements of the Political Reform Act of 1974, Government Code section 81000 et seq.
- (d) When writing or calling state or county elections officials, provide the official title of the initiative which was prepared by the Attorney General. Use of this title will assist elections officials in referencing the proper file.
- (e) When a petition is presented to the county elections official for filing by someone other than the proponent, the required authorization shall include the name or names of the persons filing the petition.
- (f) When filing the petition with the county elections official, please provide a blank petition for elections official use.

NOTE TO PROPONENTS WHO WISH TO QUALIFY FOR THE NOVEMBER 3, 1992 GENERAL ELECTION: This initiative must be certified for the ballot 131 days before the election (June 25, 1992). Please remember to time your submissions accordingly.

The Attorney General of California has prepared the following title and summary of the chief purpose and points of the proposed measure:

HEALTH CARE PLAN. INITIATIVE STATUTE. Directs Legislature and Governor to establish health care plan to ensure coverage for all employees by or through their employer and every other resident of the state. Authorizes Legislature to require recipients to pay portion of plan cost. With stated exceptions, plan shall be financed in total by existing health care expenditures. Mandates overall medical care cost reduction below cost level of 1993-4 fiscal year; minimum 5 percent cost reductions as specified. Authorizes cost-controls to maintain medical care cost inflation at or below Consumer Price Index. Implementation to commence in 1994; be completed by 1997. Summary of estimate by Legislative Analyst and Director of Finance of fiscal impact on state and local governments: No direct fiscal effect because there is no specific requirement that the program be implemented. If health insurance program enacted, program would have unknown net fiscal impact on the state and local governments, with potential increased costs to the state and savings to the counties.

INITIATIVE MEASURE TO BE SUBMITTED DIRECTLY TO THE VOTERS

The Attorney General of California has prepared the following title and summary of the chief purpose and points of the proposed measure:

TO THE HONORABLE SECRETARY OF STATE OF CALIFORNIA

We, the undersigned, registered, qualified voters of California, residents of _____ County (or City and County), hereby propose the following, and petition the Secretary of State to submit the same to the voters of California for their adoption or rejection at the next succeeding general election or at any special statewide election held prior to the general election or otherwise provided by law. The proposed statutory amendments read as follows:

SECTION 1. (a) The people of the State of California recognize the crisis in access and affordability of health care.

(b) In the belief that health care is a basic human right, it is the intent of the people that the Legislature and the Governor establish a health care plan to cover all of the residents of the state, as provided in this measure.

SEC. 2. It is the intent of the people that the Legislature do all of the following:

(a) Establish a system of health care, to be cited or referred to as the California Health Plan, through which every employee shall receive coverage by his or her employer or through which their employer shall pay a tax to ensure that those employees are covered by a health plan purchased for them by the state.

(b) Provide for the health care coverage for every other resident of the state.

SEC. 3. The health care plan established by the Legislature may provide that the recipient of health care coverage provided through an employer or through a health care plan purchased by the state may be required to pay for a portion of the cost of the plan.

SEC. 4. With the exception of Section 3, it is the intent of the people that the health care plan shall be financed, in total, by existing health care expenditures.

SEC. 5. The people intended that any health care system established pursuant to legislative mandate shall be one whereby overall medical care costs in this state shall be reduced below the level of cost during the 1993-94 fiscal year by at least 5 percent through the reduction of administrative costs, the fostering of preventative health care, and the elimination of duplicative services.

SEC. 6. Any health care plan established by the Legislature should contain a system of cost-controls that keep future medical care cost inflation at or below the level of the Consumer Price Index.

SEC. 7. The people further intend that the Legislature provide for the implementation of the California Health Plan to commence not later than January 1, 1994, and for full implementation of the plan not later than January 1, 1997.
