Dear Roger:

I am sending you the suggestions and comments on the charter and by-laws prepared by the Fund staff. They are being circulated among the members of the working committee in the hope that they will help stimulate their own critiques. If all goes well, we should have most of the comments available before we meet in San Francisco.

Concerning the meeting, I have asked committee members to try to get to San Francisco by Thursday evening so we can have the entire day Friday and at least half of Saturday to review the drafts and approve the charter and by-laws. In addition, they will be selecting candidates for both the council and its staff.
